A Bride Adorned for Her Husband

Revelation 21:1, 2, 9, 10

- 1 And I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth were passed away; and the sea is no more.
- 2 And I, John, saw the holy city New Jerusalem coming down from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband.
- 9 And there came to me one of the seven angels, having the seven bowls filled with the seven last plagues, and he spoke with me, saying, Come, I will show thee the bride, the Lamb's wife.
- 10 And he carried me away in the spirit on a great and high mountain, and showed me the great city, the holy Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God.

Conjugial Love 81

I looked again towards the eastern heaven and a light shone forth on the right, and this light entered the southern expanse. And I heard a sweet sound, and asked the angel, "What of the Lord are they glorifying there?"

He said, "These words in the Apocalypse: I saw a new heaven and a new earth, and I saw the holy city, the New Jerusalem, descending from God out of heaven prepared as a bride for her husband. And the angel spake with me and said, Come hither, I will show thee the bride, the Lamb's wife. And he carried me away in the spirit upon a mountain, great and high, and showed me the city, the holy Jerusalem (Rev. xxi. 1, 2, 9, 10).

And with these words:

I Jesus am the bright and morning Star. And the Spirit and the Bride say, Come. He said, Yes I come quickly, Amen. Yes, come, Lord Jesus (xxii. 16, 17, 20)"....

On hearing and understanding these glorifications my heart exulted, and in joy I went home. And there, from the state of the spirit I returned into that of the body; in which state I wrote down the things that were seen and heard. To which I now add this: That conjugial love will be raised up anew by the

Lord after His advent, such as it was with the ancients. For that love is of the Lord alone, and is with those who are made spiritual by Him through the Word.

Pastor's Notes

The Lord used the imagery of marriage to describe the Holy City New Jerusalem in the end of the Book of Revelation (Rev. 21:2,9). And in *Conjugial Love* 81 we learn that the very verses comparing the Holy City to a bride and wife in Revelation were heard in heaven as a sweet sound glorifying the Lord and celebrating His advent. The passage in *Conjugial Love* explains further that while these words from Scripture describing the Holy City in the context of marriage were spoken by angels, the sky in the eastern heaven shone with a brilliant light (CL 81). In response to this joyful heavenly event, the Lord gave this to Swedenborg to write:

That conjugial love will be raised up anew by the Lord after His advent, such as it was with the ancients. For that love is of the Lord alone, and is with those who are made spiritual by Him through the Word. (CL 81)

What a tremendously merciful promise! The Second Coming of the Lord will result in marriage being raised up anew in its most innocent form. And the Lord wants us to know about it so that the church and therefore the special love from Him in marriage, called conjugial love, can be established in each of us!

HOLY SUPPER will be offered this month in church on Wednesday, June 18th, at 7:30 p.m. at the church. This service will be similar to the one we do before Easter. There will be extended readings about the establishment of the New Church from the *Book of Revelation* and *Apocalypse Revealed*.

SUMMER "SUNDAY SCHOOL" SERVICES:

Parents, please take careful note about these services, which happen three times during the summer. During the summer the children's talk is not followed by a Sunday School class. Instead, parents are expected to supervise their children in the barn or outside during the sermon (making sure people outside are not within the view of worshippers inside).

It is important that all children actually be supervised in order to protect them from hurting others or having to endure the bad behavior of others. Thank you to parents, individually and collectively, for pulling together to make sure our kids are protected.

In the case of rain, certain indoor spaces may be used in addition to the barn, but it's imperative that an adult be in any room in which there are children, whatever their age. Close supervision matters in these spaces that are developed, used, and cared for by those who work in the school, to whom we need to show respect. All places should of course be left as clean and tidy as you will undoubtedly find them. Available in bad weather (only): the 7th-8th classrooms, and the Commons.

As on every Sunday, please supervise your children when church is over, whether in the Society Room or outside.

WOODS / OUTDOOR SERVICES: On the last Sunday of each summer month (June 29, July 27, August 31, and September 28), there will be an indoor 9:00 a.m. Family Service and a 10:00 a.m. Family Service in the woods. If it rains, the 10:00 a.m. Woods Service will be held indoors, and the 9:00 a.m. indoor service will happen as well.

How to get to the woods: Park at the church, cross the street, and walk down the lane, following the signs. There is also parking in a field at the end of the lane, on the right, for those who prefer not to walk. Please stay on church property (toward the left as you travel the lane), and avoid driving onto our neighbor's property toward the right.

SUMMER DOCTRINAL CLASS: This summer Andy, Derrick, Lawson, and I are offering a four-class series on a book titled *Authority in the New Church*, by Rev. R. L. Tafel. The book was published in 1877 and seeks to answer this question posed on page five of the book: "Where, and what, is that ultimate authority to which all the members of the Lord's Church at large, and especially the members of the Lord's New Church, should look, and by which they ought to be willing to be judged?"

We hope you will enjoy the classes. We will be looking at the first four chapters this summer. In future summers we will look at the last six chapters as well as the appendices. Copies of the book can be printed on demand so please let me know if you would like one so we can have them printed in time for the first class. A sign-up sheet will be available after church on Sunday and at Jen's desk. The cost is \$10. Printouts of individual chapters will be available if you prefer not to buy the book.
